



A Pathway to Western Theatre Studies



This information sheet has been designed specifically for Fanshawe Theatre Arts Diploma Program graduates who would like to be considered for admission to Year 2 of the 4-year Major in Theatre Studies as part of the approved Articulation Agreement.

STEP 1: APPLY

Make an application to **Upper Year** of Arts and Humanities through the OUAC (Ontario Universities Application Centre) at ouac.on.ca/105 by **March 1**.

Using the OUAC application, a request can be made to send mid-year Fanshawe transcripts to Western electronically. Please watch for the prompts and carefully note the timelines for sending transcripts.

STEP 2: SUBMIT DOCUMENTS

Submit

- ▶ Your mid-year Fanshawe transcript (unless requested through OUAC application previously)
- ▶ Declaration of Intent: Diploma to Degree (welcome.uwo.ca/admissions/forms)
- ▶ Your final high school transcript
- ▶ Any other documents requested in support of your application

STEP 3: OFFER OF ADMISSION

Conditional Offers:

Offers of admission are sent on a rolling basis starting in January. Conditional offers of admission will be given to applicants who are in their final semester at Fanshawe if all other admission requirements are met. Once final transcripts have been received, final transfer credit will be awarded.



Admission Requirements

- ▶ Graduate of Fanshawe's 2-year Theatre Arts program;
- ▶ Minimum cumulative average of "B+" (or 3.5 GPA);
- ▶ No grade less than "C" (or 2.0 GPA);

* Admission under this Articulation Agreement is competitive. Holding the Admission Requirements is not a guarantee of admission. The decision as to the number of students who will be accepted in any academic year may vary from year to year.

1. I'm graduating in August. Can I still apply for a September start?

If you are graduating in August and you meet the requirements, you may be admitted to the Agreement provided there are spaces available and you are able to provide the Admissions Office with your final transcript before classes begin in September. Contact your Program Coordinator as soon as final grades are posted in August and she will contact the Registrar's Office asking that your record be updated to show you are a graduate of the program.

2. I have previously attended another university. Am I eligible for consideration under this Agreement?

This agreement has been developed as a pathway for applicants without previous university experience. If you have attended another post-secondary institution prior to your attendance at Fanshawe, please contact Western's Admissions Office.

3. How many credits would I receive? When will I finish my degree?

Applicants completing or holding a Diploma in Theatre Arts will be eligible to receive up to 4.0 credits for courses completed in the Theatre Arts Program. To graduate with the Major in Theatre Studies module, students admitted under this Articulation Agreement must successfully complete the 6.0 courses listed below, plus a minimum of 10.0 further credits for a non-honors 4-Year Bachelor of Arts (20.0 credits).**
